

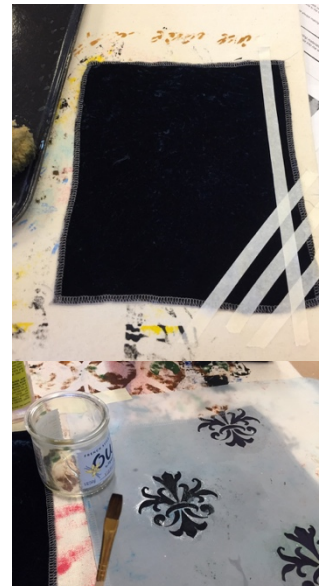
Devoré Process

1. First I cut the large piece into smaller pieces then surged the edges
2. Then we dyed the fabric

- a. Acid Dye – Color: Fire Engine Red
  - i. 16 cups of water
  - ii. 1 teaspoon of dye pasted out
  - iii. Added fabric
  - iv. Cooked for 7 Minuets
  - v. Took out fabric
  - vi. Added ¼ cup of citric acid crystals
  - vii. Cooked for 5 more minuets
  - viii. Took out and rinsed in warm water
- b. Drama Fiber Reactive Dye – Color: Raven
  - i. 16 cups of water
  - ii. 1 teaspoon of dye
  - iii. Added fabric
  - iv. Cooked for 7 minuets
  - v. 1/6 cup of soda ash dissolved in water
  - vi. Took out fabric
  - vii. Added soda ash into dye bath
  - viii. Added fabric
  - ix. Cooked for 5 more minuets
  - x. Took out and rinsed in warm water



3. Dried the fabric in the drying cabinet
4. Then I took the fiber etch and put it on the fabric
  - a. Method 1: multiple test types on both the front and back
    - i. Tape and sponge
    - ii. Tape and brush
    - iii. Free hand with brush
    - iv. Free hand with sponge
    - v. Right out of the bottle
  - b. Method 2: Stencil on both front and back to see which burns out better
  - c. Method 3: Right out of the bottle but with words
5. Then I put them in the drying cabinet to dry for a while



6. After drying, I took them out and pressed them over a towel to burn away the fibers



7. After ironing, I flipped it over and scratched at the front with my

- fingers to see if it would crumble away (it didn't the first time so I took it back to the iron)
8. After it all crumbled off onto the towel, I took it and washed it in the sink
